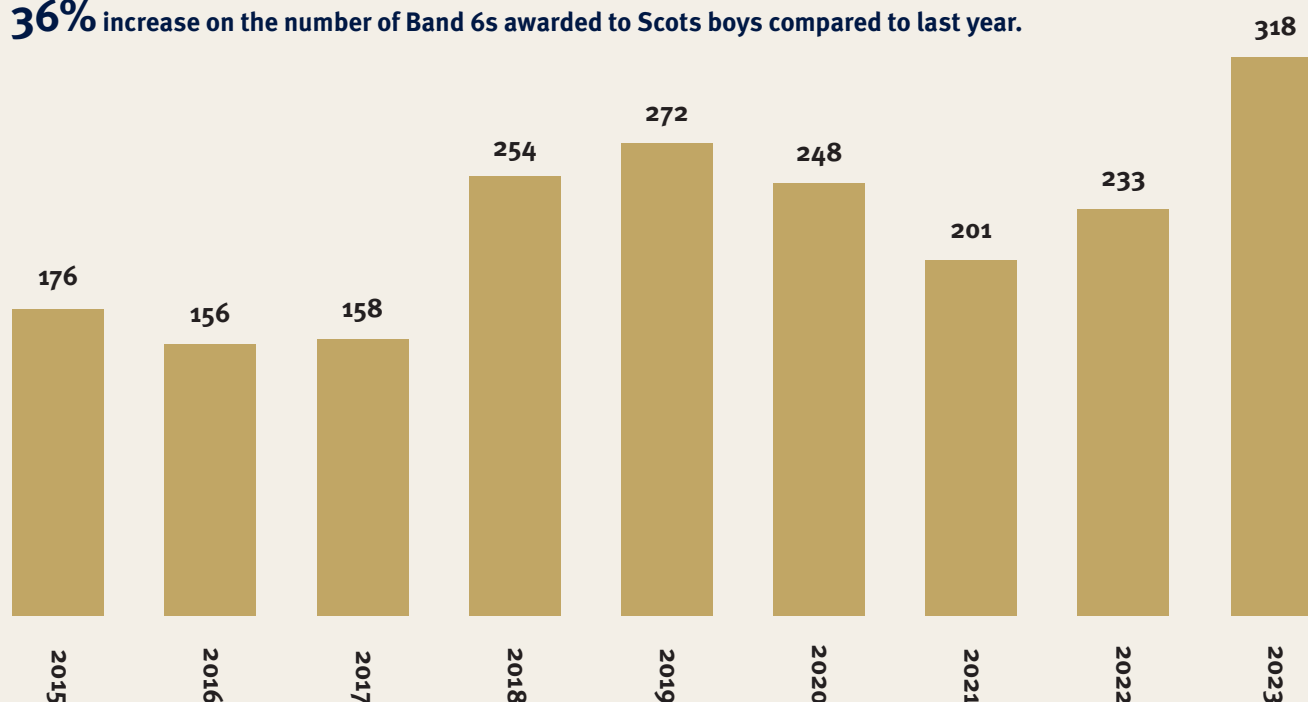

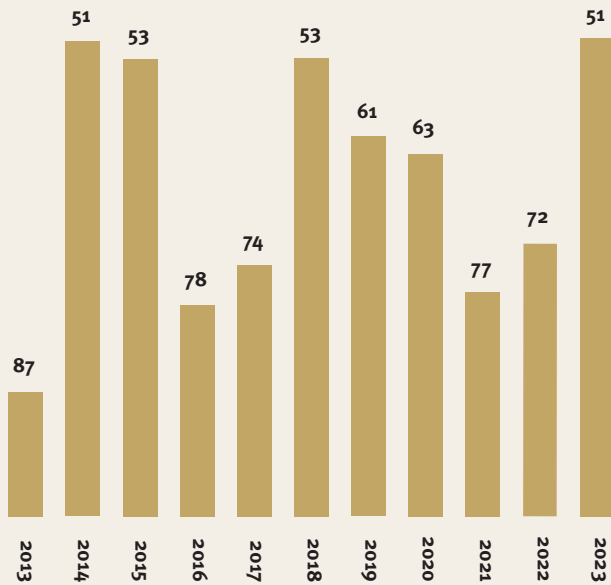

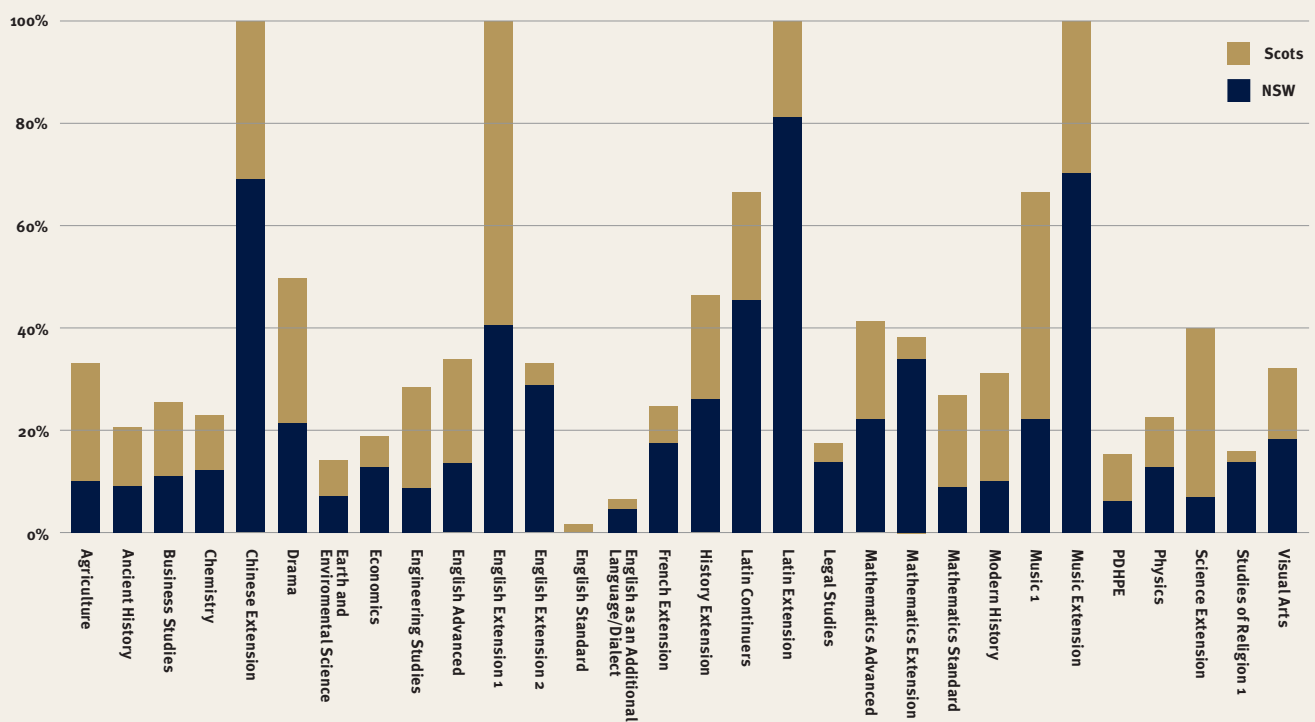

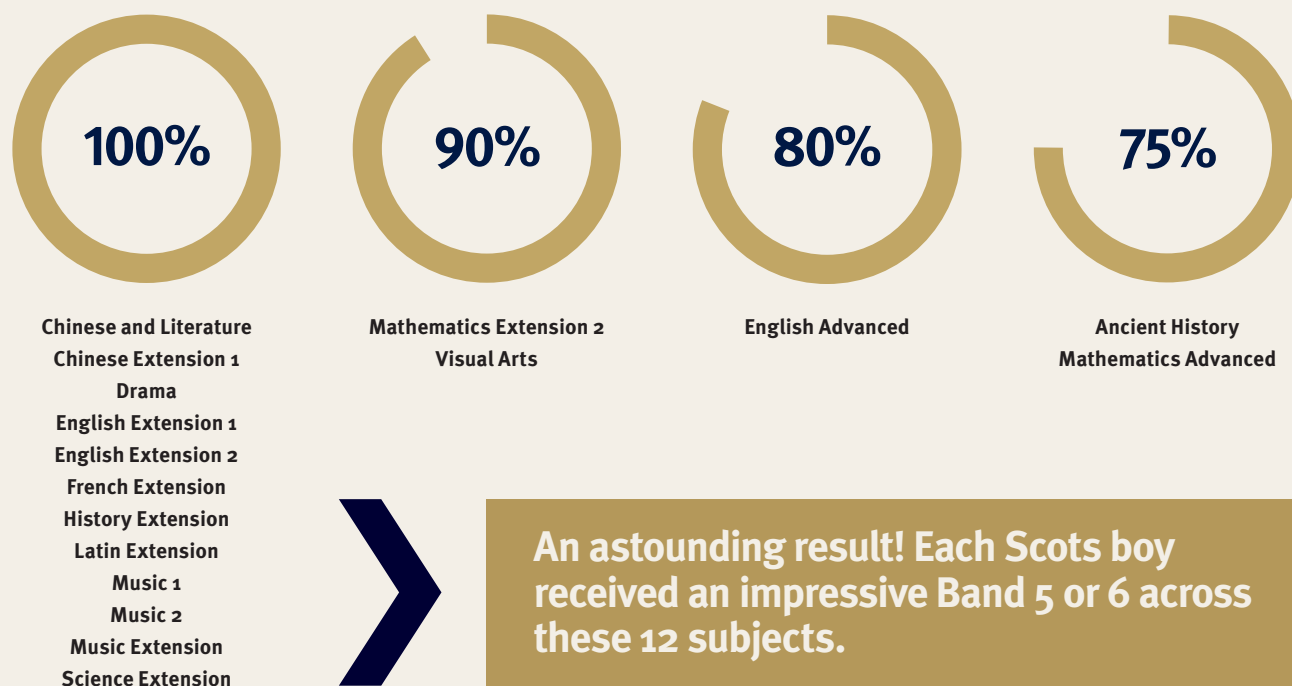
Scots Boys Awarded Band 6

Compared to the state average



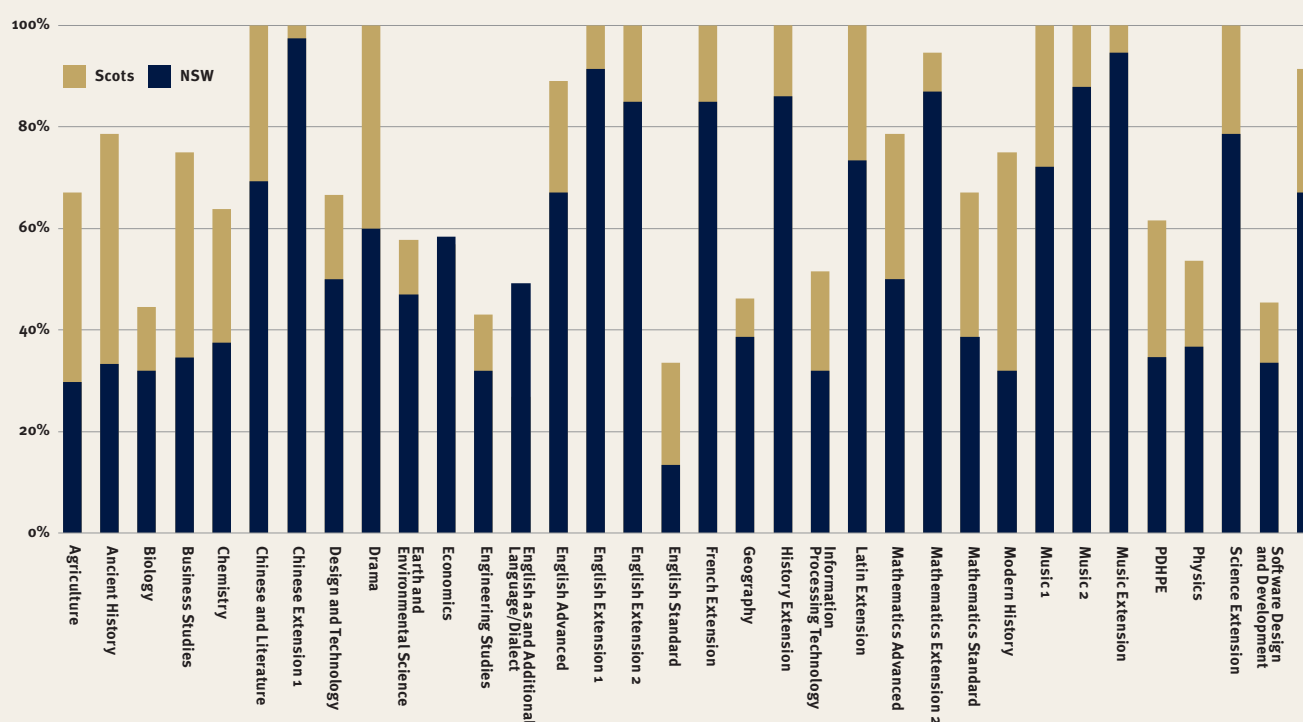

Top Performing Courses 2023

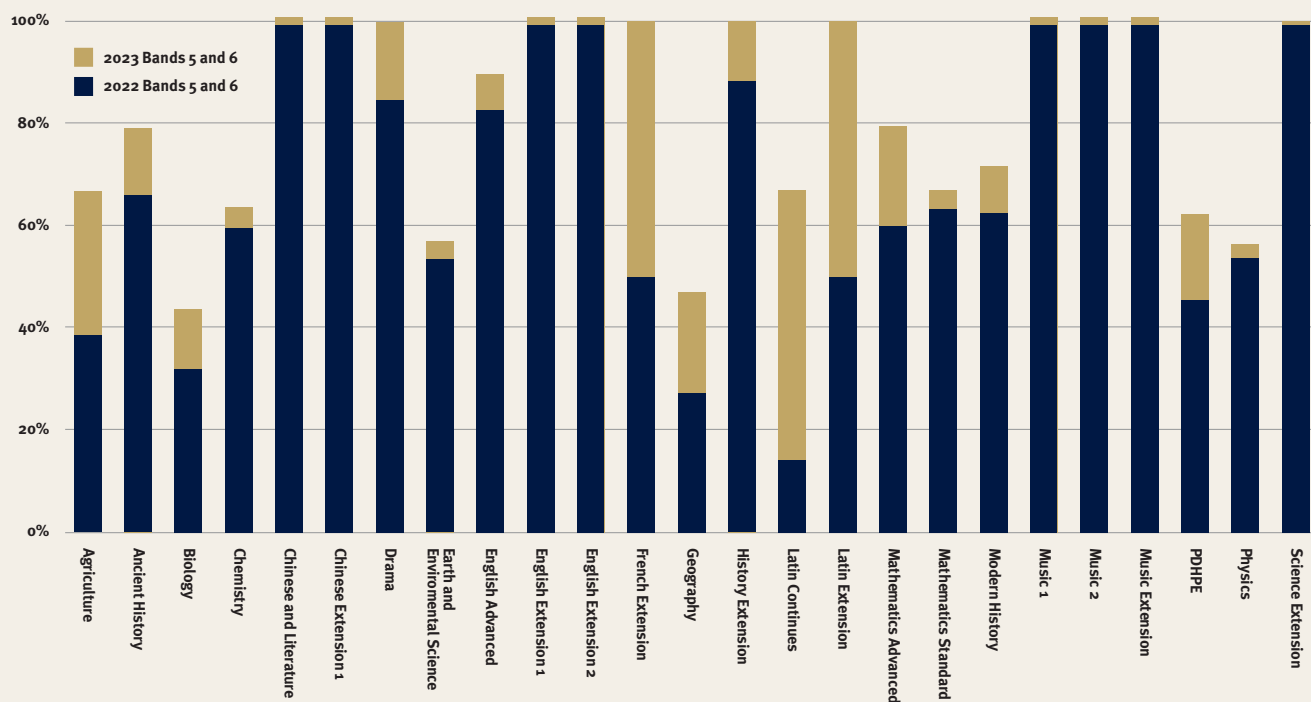
State versus Scots Bands 5 and 6 combined



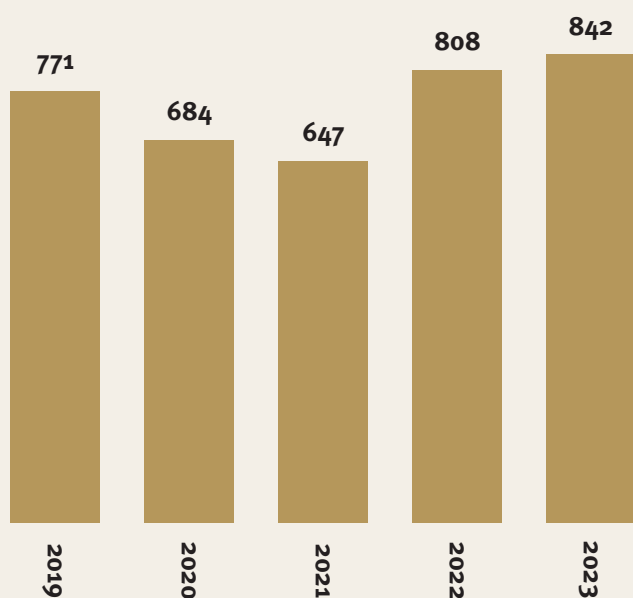

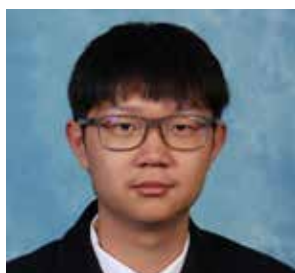

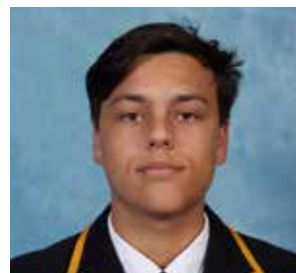

Teaching Excellence

At the founding of The Scots College in 1893, 130 years ago, the moderator of the Presbyterian Church described its teachers as those who had won the highest honours in university, knew how to teach boys and saw their vocation as "a work of faith, a labour of love and a patience of hope".

In 2023, we continued to invest in our teachers and support staff and plan for new and optimal mechanisms to execute in 2024. There are a number of staff who have been nominated or won professional awards this year with our Head of ScotsX, Dr Hugh Chilton, selected as one of the "Most Influential Educators in Australia" in *The Educator* for 2023. This is an incredible achievement and a testament to the importance of making real change in a school community. Head of Indigenous Education, Ms Justine Kolliou received the 2023 IBSC Action Research Award for the most outstanding piece of research for her project, *My Wounds, My Country, My Masculinities: How Mentors can Support Indigenous Boys' Exploration of Masculinity*. In addition, many staff undertook further study up to the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) level, with presentations delivered at conferences around the world.

Most excitingly, our third cohort of well-trained new Christian teachers graduated through the Teaching Schools Alliance Sydney.

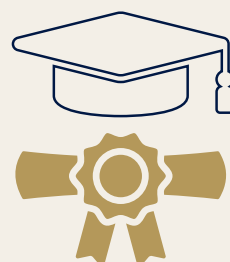
