




Scots Boys Awarded Band 6




State versus Scots Bands 5 and 6 combined





Worth the Risk –
Taking Ownership

In early 2020, Finn decided to combine his HSC pathway to pursue his ambition to become a carpenter. He began his apprenticeship in Year 11, giving him practical work experience and an advantage in completing his studies 18 months ahead of his apprenticeship cohort.

Finn combined his studies at Scots with a TAFE Certificate III in Carpentry, and part-time employment with a local construction company, Robert Plumb. He recognised that taking a non-ATAR pathway might be seen by some as a risk, but insisted "For me, it was absolutely the right choice. The Applied Entrepreneurship Program gave me the opportunity to take ownership of my studies through its flexible curriculum, rather than studying for a one-size-fits-all exam. I got to immediately apply my knowledge in authentic, real-life work scenarios. It was a win-win for me."

Finn is now in the final stages of completing his TAFE studies while working full-time as a carpenter with Robert Plumb.

Prodigious Flair for Analysis

Award winner of the Carol Manners Essay Competition, Finlay pulled out all the stops in his essay, displaying a typically prodigious flair for description and analysis. He wrote about two Roman poets he studied in his Latin Extension course, Catullus and Horace, in response to the question: To what extent does the poetry of Catullus and Horace betray an awareness of themselves as poets?

This award is organised by the Classical Languages Teachers Association for the best essay written on texts studied in either the HSC Latin Continuers or Extension courses. This competition is promoted to Year 12 Latin students across New South Wales as an opportunity to compete for a cash prize and for the essay to be published in the scholarly journal, *Classicum*.

There is no doubt that Finlay's deft and insightful investigation will turn heads in the classical world as he commences his studies at The University of Sydney.

Teaching Excellence

At the founding of The Scots College in 1893, the moderator of the Presbyterian Church described its teachers as those who had won the highest honours in university, knew how to teach Australian boys, and saw their vocation as "a work of faith, a labour of love and a patience of hope".

In 2022, Scots teachers continued to pursue The Quest for Excellence and our vision for Reinventing Education. Through a range of applied professional learning programs and courses of study, they have been developing the technical skills of the classroom and the deeper elements of expertise: vocational clarity, philosophical depth and entrepreneurial thinking. We formed the Research-Invested Schools network, bringing together over 40 schools committed to developing teaching expertise through research. Our five Master Teacher Fellows continued to mentor colleagues in experiential learning and character education. A number of staff undertook further study up to the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) level, with presentations delivered at conferences around the world. Most excitingly, our second cohort of well-trained new Christian teachers graduated through the Teaching Schools Alliance Sydney.
